

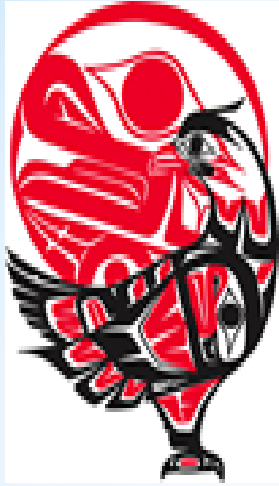

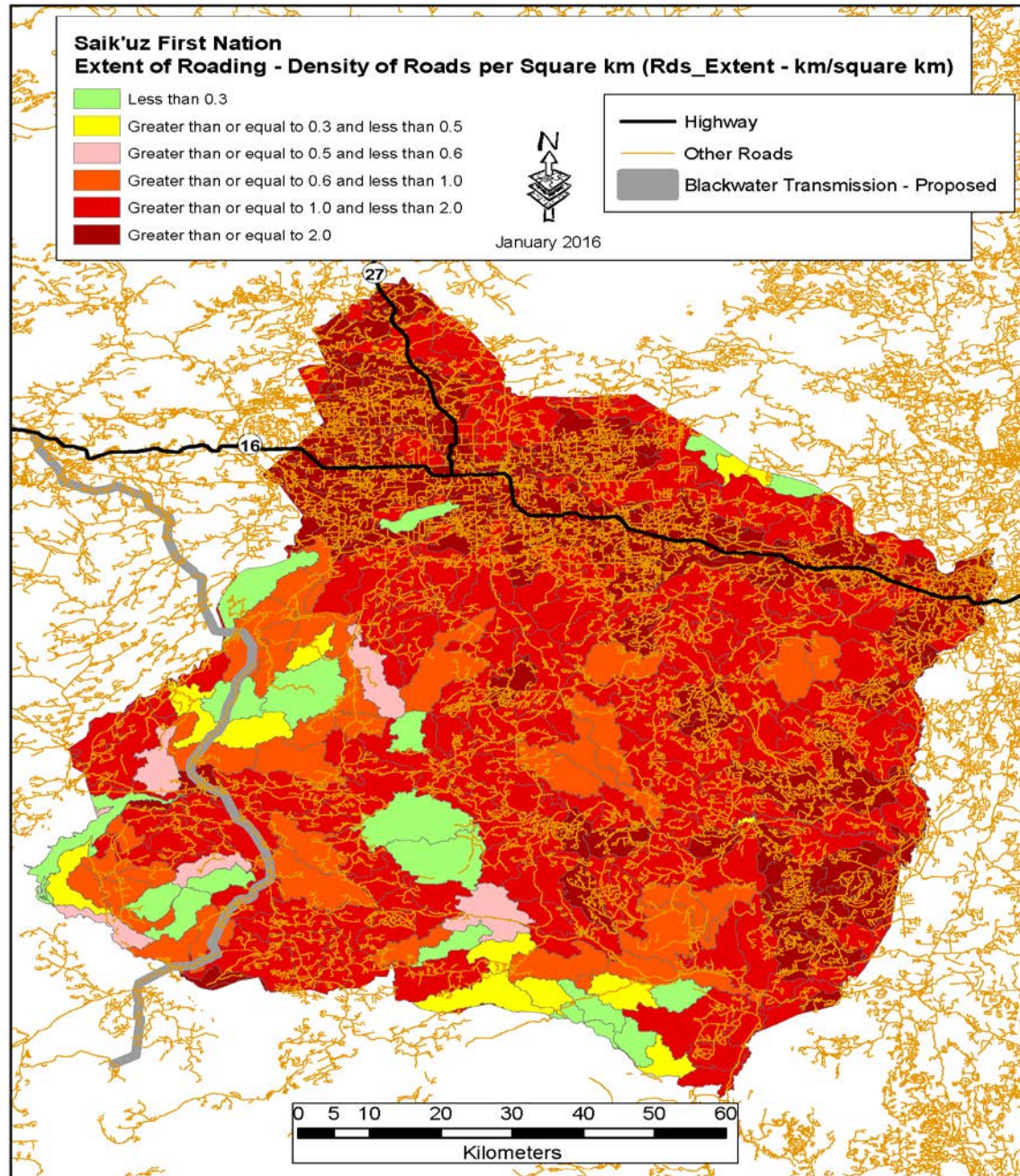

* To ensure that the social fabric of our community is strengthened through the practice of our language and culture

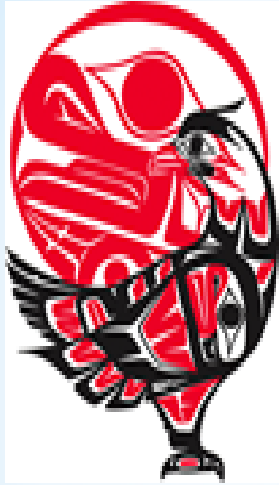
1. Update received on the socio-cultural elements of the CSFN Collaboration Agreement
